

WOODLAND CAMPGROUND RULES FOR CAMPERS

PARKING: Each site is limited to one RV and two (2) vehicles if there is enough gravel area. NO PARKING on the grass.

SITE ALTERATIONS: The defacing, cutting or breaking of trees and/or bushes or other site alterations is NOT ALLOWED.

QUIET HOURS are Sunday – Thursday 10 pm – 8 am and Friday & Saturday 11 pm – 8 am. Campers under 18 are to be at their sites by 10 pm unless accompanied by an adult.

CHILDREN under 12 must be supervised by an adult in the game room, while riding carts/bikes, using sports equipment, & especially by the lake. Per PA laws, children under age 12 must wear a helmet when riding bikes. No bike riding after

CAMPFIRES: Fires are only permitted in fire rings. DO NOT move the fire ring. Fire rings are for the burning of firewood and paper ONLY. NO burning trash (especially plastic or Styrofoam).

For the safety of all campers, extinguish campfires before leaving the campground.

WILD ANIMALS: It is against the law to feed wild animals. DO NOT leave food scraps in fire rings. This will draw wild animals.

TRASH: Dispose of trash in the dumpsters provided & located near the entrance/exit gate. Do not leave any trash in the fire ring. We appreciate your help to keep sites clean & ready for the next campers to pull in.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: Responsible consumption is permitted in the campground in a cup or koozie/can wrap.

FIREWORKS & WEAPONS are prohibited on campground property.

FIREWOOD: PA regulations do not allow for wood to be transported across county or state lines. Firewood is available for purchase at the camp office/store.

VISITORS

- 1. ALL VISITORS AND GUESTS OF CAMPERS MUST CHECK-IN at the office BEFORE going to your site. Daytime visitors: No charge; must leave the campground by Quiet Hours. Overnight guest fees: \$5 per adult (18 +), \$2 per child (17 - 10), under 10 free.
- 2. Each site is limited to one RV and two (2) vehicles if there is enough gravel area. If there is no space at your site, visitors must park in the area across from the office (next to the Elk Cabin) or in the mowed field across the street. Visitors are not to park in other people's sites.
- 3. If your visitor brings a pet with them, it is your responsibility to make sure they follow all the rules pertaining to pets at the campground.
- 4. You are responsible for the behavior of your guests while they are on Campground property. Guests can & will be ejected from the campground for behavior The Campground deems unacceptable for our familyfriendly setting.

PET REGULATIONS

- 1. Pets must be kenneled or on a maximum 6 ft leash at your site and throughout the campground (except in designated off-leash area). Do not allow your dog to roam your site off-leash.
- OFF-LEASH Play Area (OLA): Balls and other toys are in the OLA for you to use while there with your pet. Pet waste must be cleaned up and disposed of in a timely manner at your site, in the OLA or elsewhere on the grounds. Pet waste bags and waste receptacle are located on a post at the entrance to the OLA. Watch your pet carefully to make sure you know if you need to clean-up after them.
- Please be considerate & help keep all pets healthy!
- Pets may not be left unattended at your site for extended periods of time. All pets must be up to date on their Rabies vaccine. Campers should be prepared to produce a shot record if requested.
- 5. If any dog's behavior becomes a problem, that dog will not be allowed to remain in the campground. The Campground will exercise our right to ban any pet from the campground if we determine that is necessary to maintain a safe and pleasant environment for ALL campers. The determination will be solely at the discretion of The Campground.
